lumbung Kios is a network of decentralized and self-run kios at different locations by the lumbung members, lumbung artists, and their local ekosistem. It's also an attempt to decentralize distribution mechanisms and to explore alternative and sustainable economies. The aim is to keep the environmental impact as low as possible. For this reason, lumbung Kios partly tries to experiment with the Feral Trade (a mechanism that was established by artist Kate Rich) to trade goods using the active-physical mobility resources of lumbung Kios' existing social network. There will be diverse physical lumbung Kios during documenta fifteen: at ruruHaus in cooperation with Walter König Bookstore, at Hübner area and at the spaces of the network of Kios' local shop partners that are spread through the city of Kassel.

lumbung Kios works in collaboration with: Colorlabor, kmmn_practice, Galerie auf Zeit (GaZ), Wildwood Gallery and Store, ZweiPunktNull, Stadtliebe, Lost & Found Record Store, Rotopol, Sandershaus and WIKULLiL at Lemon House. The wish is to be able to work with a few more. currently, there are still some conversations going on with several other local shop partners in Kassel.

Project Art Works

Project Art Works is a UK-based collective of artists and makers. They produce and disseminate art underpinned by radical approaches to neurodiversity, rights, and representation. INSTAR is the acronym of our Institute, The Instituto de Artivismo Hannah Arendt, and at the same time it's also a verb that means to motivate and to inspire. We used "INSTAR to revolt", which also became a part of our campaign in 2021 in Cuba.

Instituto de Artivismo Hannah Arendt (INSTAR)

The Instituto de Artivismo Hannah Arendt (INSTAR) was born out of an artistic action, Tania Bruguera collective reading of Arendt's The Origins of Totalitarianism collectively talking about the lack of trust (1951), in Havana, Cuba, in May 2015. The institute's main objectives are the promotion of civic literacy and social justice in Cuba. Operating collectively and by

consensus, it creates a model of institutionality guided by freedom of expression, the observance of human rights, and the fulfillment of labor rights such as fair working hours and wages, zero tolerance to discrimination, and favorable working environments for single-parent families.

It is a reissue of the T-shirt collectively created during the first INSTAR workshop in 2017. It was a workshop given by Brian Holmes, Claire Pentecost and Critical Art Ensemble. The text imprinted in this t-shirt was inspired by participants who were on so many people in their home country because people were snitching to the secret police.

The Rural School of Economics – Myvillages

The Rural School of Economics – Myvillages, as a member of Composting Knowledge, has been active on the territory and neighborhoods of the Hessen region for over one year. Myvillages has been looking for rural undercurrents in and around Kassel since June 2022, making sure they notice and pay attention to under-valued knowledge and practices.

IERIEN/ZII. Book



The book *Boerenzij* | *The Rural Side* created with and by Rotterdammers places rural mindsets and imaginations in the midst of the current gentrification of Rotterdam-Zuid. Besides texts by Wapke Feenstra and researcher Kevser Güler, the book contains many images such as drawings, film stills and photos of rural objects – all inspired by encounters with rural migrants from far away or nearby Rotterdam.

Cinema Caravan

Cinema Caravan is a group of primates in the Good Vibes Hominidae family. Their main habitat is the Zushi area in Japan, but its sphere of activity is not limited to this area. Each individual has its own unique abilities and ecosystem, but the group is able to adapt to any environment. They are fueled by "travel," and once they are in harmony, they create a variety of objects, sounds, and spaces, refining and injecting "love" in its purest form. Cinema Caravan is a diverse group of friends, who have their own unique power to live, to strengthen each other through journeys and to experience various kinds of richness surrounding them.

Paul Colley has created a substantial body of work in collaboration with the photographer and artist, Georgie Scott. The release of this selection of playful and intimate photographic portraits presents a window into Paul's world, where you meet the people important to him, and his creative process within and outside of the studios is revealed. Through subtle direction from Paul, Georgie sets up complex environments and table-based installations. Images are edited and printed onto acetates and perspex, attached to hand-held wood blocks or made into paper objects and books that Paul holds and turns or carefully arranges and then re-photographs or dismantles.

This two-faced wolf candle is inspired by Janus, the Roman god that stands for ambivalence. Janus represented the middle ground between both concrete and abstract dualities. As for the local context, around the last millennium, wolves came back to Germany from the east, crossing the river Oder in Saxony and finding their way to the Lüneburger Heathlands. Since 2012, a pack of wolves has been living close to Neuenkirchen. Wolves are a hotly discussed subject and mirror reactions to the unknown as mixed reactions coming from the local residents.

Nhà Sàn Collective (NSC)

Nhà Sàn Collective (NSC) began operating as an independent artist collective in Hanoi in 2013. With or without a physical base, NSC has worked with fellow companions and collaborators to organize exhibitions, workshops, film screenings, talks, and other activities as a support platform for artists in the community. The initiative wants to encourage exchange, expansion. and connection.



By the bank of the Red River in Ngoc Thuy, Hanoi, the artists imagine the remodeling of Nguyễn Mạnh Đức's new house — where the Nhà Sàn Collective's new space, once again rebuilt and transformed. Two years prior, in 2020, the original Nhà Sàn (Vietnamese for House on Stilts), the physical space of Nhà Sàn Studio, was dismantled as the landlord wished to reclaim its site.

ZK/U Center for Art and Urbanistics

ZK/U – Center for Art and Urbanistics is an artist and research residency that has hosted more than 500 artists since its opening in 2012. KUNSTrePUBLIK is the organization behind ZK/U — an artist collective that has been working in the public sphere for more than fifteen years. Through tangible projects they have been exploring the potentials and limitations of art.

> The artist collective Art Ashram explored a marlstone pit on the river banks of Hannover to excavate hundreds of Belemnites. These million-year old fossils were the starting point for drawing, creating, and storytelling about possible and impossible futures with children from a local school. Those investigations were presented, accompanied by primordial soup, at the Hiroshima-Ufer in Kassel. The graphic on the tote bag is a result of a playful arrangement of Belemnite on images in art history books and was individually hand-printed by Andreas Kräftner.

The Citizenship Logbook was produced in a limited edition on the occasion of the citizenship trip from Berlin to Kassel. In June – July 2022, the Center for Art and Urbanistics (ZK/U) literally raised the roof of its home base in Berlin, and then sailed in it to documenta fifteen — a trip of 650 km, fueled entirely by people power! At circa forty stopover points en route to Kassel, the crew and locals have ample opportunities to pool their knowledge, share their schemes for planetary survival, and enjoy a diverse program of events.

Through anthropological fieldwork and critical analysis, the book explores how socially engaged art offers creative and critical approaches to these issues in the context of the contemporary Chinese regime.
